Fiant aures tuæ intendentes Let your ears be attentive in orationem servi tui. to the prayer of your servant, Lord.

[Three women's parts join = SSATTBB = 7] Si iniquitates observaveris, Domine, If you keep track of our sins, Lord, Domine, quis sustinebit? Lord, who will bear it?

[climax = forgiveness]
