I. Kyrie 1

[The Mass opens with *Kyrie 1* and its three massive blocks of sound, each connected by rising sopranos]

Kyrie eleison.

Lord, have mercy.

[Instrumental ritornello, built on the fugue subject, heard first in the oboe d'amore – about 1 min. 30 sec.
long]

[The vocal soloists now begin singing the fugue subject - about 4 min 10 sec. long]
