4. *Gloria* and *Et in terra pax* [Luke 2:14]

[Orchestral introduction using the full chamber orchestra, including 3 straight trumpets and 2 timpani.]

[Both the solo voices and then the choir briefly quote from the gospel of Luke:] *Gloria in excelsis Deo.*

Glory to God in the highest.

[Orchestra briefly recalls the final measures of its opening music.]

[Choir now expands on Luke's exuberant words of praise:] *Gloria in excelsis Deo.* Glory to God in the highest.

[Suddenly the music becomes more peaceful, no trumpets or drums.]

Et in terra pax hominibus bonæ voluntatis. And on earth, peace to people of goodwill.

[A quiet, peaceful orchestral interlude, over a sustained low note (E).]

[The soprano soloist now introduces a new fugue theme, which other voices will imitate; each time you hear "Et in terra pax" it is likely the fugue theme.] *Et in terra pax hominibus bonæ voluntatis.* And on earth, peace to people of goodwill.

[Choir now enters, and eventually returns to the fugue theme.] *Et in terra pax hominibus bonæ voluntatis.* And on earth, peace to people of goodwill.

[Closing words to our theme song:] *O! dass diess jeder Sünder wüsste, O! that every sinner would know this, Sein Herz wohl bald dich lieben müsste.* His heart must soon surely love You.
