[Complicated five-part fugue]

*Confiteor unum baptismam.*

I confess one baptism

[Second fugue theme, clearly heard the first time, then it is hidden in the complicated music.]

*in remissionem peccatorum*

for the remission of sins.

*Confiteor unum baptismam.*

I confess one baptism

*in remissionem peccatorum*

for the remission of sins.

[Becomes less intense, slower, less complicated, wanders about as we wait.]

*Et expecto resurrectionem mortuorum.*

And I await the resurrection of the dead.

9. *Et expecto* [much faster, with full orchestra including timpani and trumpets, choir, soloists]

[Soprano solo makes the transition into No. 9:]

*Et ex-pec-*

And I await-

[Chorus and full orchestra burst in—a good depiction of the suddenness Second Coming?]

*Et expecto resurrectionem mortuorum.*

And I await the resurrection of the dead

[Brief instrumental interlude, followed by soloists and choir.]

*Et expecto resurrectionem mortuorum.*

And I await the resurrection of the dead

*Et vitam venturi sæculi. Amen*

and the life in the world to come. Amen.

[Orchestral interlude, trumpets and timpani]

[soloists, then choir]

*Et vitam venturi sæculi. Amen*

and the life in the world to come. Amen.

[soloists, then choir sing one fast “Amen”!]

*Amen.*

[Closing words to our theme song:]

*O! dass diess jeder Sünder wüsste,*

O! that every sinner would know this,

*Sein Herz wohl bald dich lieben müsste.*
