### No. 1: Blessed are they that considereth the poor and needy

Tenor Aria based on Psalm 41:1-2a

Blessed are they that considereth the poor and needy: the Lord will deliver them in time of trouble, the Lord <u>preserve</u> them and comfort them.

## No. 2: Blessed are they that considereth the poor and needy

Choir, based on Psalm 41:1-3

[Slow, possibly depicting poverty and trouble]
Blessed are they that considereth the poor and needy:
the Lord will deliver them in time of trouble,

### the Lord preserve them and comfort them.

[Faster, "deliver" is an action verb.]
[The sopranos will then have a choral-like theme I have not identified.]
[This part of the movement is taken directly from Handel's *Funeral Anthem for Queen Caroline,* HWV 264, but the Psalm is now unaltered, whereas for the late Queen, it was tailored to her alone.]

They deliver the poor that crieth, the fatherless and him that hath none to help him.

The Lord will comfort them.

[Notice how the movement suddenly ends with slower music for the words "none, none to help him."]

[Closing words to our theme song:]

O! dass diess jeder Sünder wüsste,

O! that every sinner would know this,

Sein Herz wohl bald dich lieben müsste.

His heart must soon surely love You.
