[Lively—but also occasionally alternating with the 'comfort in sickness' motif.] Keep them alive, let them be blessed upon the earth and not deliver them unto their foes.

No. 6: The People will Tell of Their Wisdom

[Duet for two sopranos]

The people will tell of their wisdom

And the congregation will shew forth their praise

[Ecclesiasticus 44:15]

[Instrumental interlude introducing music which recalls joyful courtly dance steps.]

Their reward is with the Lord and the care of them is with the Most High.

[Wisdom 5:15b]

No. 7: Hallelujah! [Copied directly from Messiah, 1741]

[Chorus; Revelation 19:6, 16; 11:15]

Hallelujah!

[Imitative]

For the Lord God omnipotent reigneth.

[Slower, chordal, contrasting "this world" and "the kingdom of our Lord"] The Kingdom of this world is become the kingdom of our Lord and of His Christ,

[Imitative: Basses, Tenors, Altos, Sopranos] and He shall reign forever and ever.

[Initially repeated three times, each statement higher than the last] King of kings and Lord of lords. Hallelujah!

[Closing words to our theme song:]

O! dass diess jeder Sünder wüsste,

O! that every sinner would know this,

Sein Herz wohl bald dich lieben müsste.

His heart must soon surely love You.
